We Can Furnish Railroad Supplies to the World.

## JAPAN BUYS FROM THE U. S.

The First Steamer of Big Fleet Leaves New York For Dalny, Carrying Railroad Equipment for Manchurian Railroad—Forty Steamers Will Be Used.

NEW YORK, July 20.—The first steamer of a big fleet specially chartered for the purpose of carrying hundreds of thousands of tons of American railroad locomotives, cars and other railroad equipment for the vast network of lines building in Manchuria by the Japanese, has sailed from this port. It was the Askehall, under the British flag and will go direct to Dalny, the principal seaport terminal of the road to be called the South-Manchurian railroad. This is the first instance of a direct sailing from New York City to Dalny. Forty steamers will be used to carry American rails, etc., for the South Man-

churian system. It is estimated that before completion of the system no less than 400,000 tons of material will be shipped from this side. This huge tonnage will be moved inside of twelve months. The contracts so far placed in this country involve an expenditure of fully \$10,000,000.

### STONED WHILE MOTORING.

Queen of Portugal and Son Attacked by Hoodlums—Culprits Escaped.

LONDON, July 20.—Dispatches from Lisbon and Bucharest bring stories of royalty being stoned while motoring. While Queen Maria of Portugal and her son, Prince Manuel, were automobiling they were stoned by hoodlums. Her majesty was struck on the arm but not seriously hurt. The culprits escaped. Crown Prince Ferdinand of Roumania was stoned and hurt. The Prince alighted from the car, chased and captured the man whom he handed over to the police officer.

### ASPHALTUM DISCOVERY.

SHOSHONE, Wis., July 20.—The discovery of thick beds of asphaltum in the Shoshone oil fields at the Eastern base of Copper Mountain is reported. Many large samples of an excellent grade of this material have been brought into town within the last few days from these oil fields.

## SEASIDE ELECTION YESTERDAY

RETURNS SHOW THAT NON-RESIDENTS CARRIED THE DAY AGAINST THE RESIDENTS—THE LOSERS WILL CONTEST.

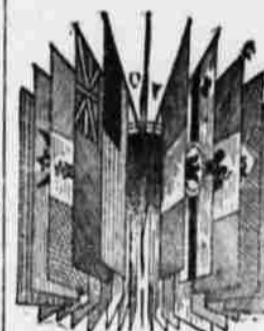
SEASIDE, Or., July 20.—One of the most important elections ever held in West Seaside occurred today. A full city ticket was elected and a fight was on between two factions, the resident and non-resident owners. The resident owners called their ticket the "Citizens and Home Rule" ticket while the non-residents headed their ticket "Home Owners' Rule." Legal opinion had been sought by the residents and according to that opinion the non-residents were not entitled to hold office nor to vote. The vote of the Portland residents was challenged but Justice Logan and Dan J. Malarkey permitted the vote to be cast on the ground that the voters were property owners and were entitled to vote under the charter. The election was quiet yet the interest was keen. When the votes were counted it was found that the "Owners' Rule" ticket (the Portland owners), had defeated the "Citizens and Home Rule" ticket (the West Seaside residents), by a vote of 3 to 1. A. H. Wilson was elected Mayor over Alex Ketterman by a vote of 37 to 12. H. M. Wheatley was elected recorder, W. L. Heninger, treasurer, and S. D. Lindsley, marshal. While Messrs. Wheatley and Heninger were on the "Home Owners Rule" ticket they are residents of Seaside and sympathizers with the boulevard and walk ordinance. W. P. Grimes and Albert Johnson were elected to the city council, both on the "Citizens and Home Rule" ticket. The nine Portland men elected to the city council are: A. T. Butterfield, G. H. Hill, E. C. Johnson, J. F. Logan, A. G. Long, Dan J. Malarkey, C. H. Precedemer, Edgar R. Piper and R. W. Wilson.

The citizens declare that they will test the legality of the vote and election by carrying the question into the courts.
