RIOTING IN SICILY

Arrest of Foreign Minister of Public Instruction

MASS MEETING OF PROTEST

Rioting Follows Arrest of Former Official on Charge of Embezzlement While in Office—Sicilians Look Upon Arrest as an Insult—One Killed.

ROME, June 22.—Rioting of a serious character is occurring in Sicily because of the arrest of Signor Nunzio Nazi, formerly minister of public instruction on a charge of embezzlement while in office. Sicilians look upon the arrest of Nazi as an insult and mass meetings to protests were held in many towns on Sunday following which in several cases, disorders occurred.

In Nazi's native town of Torpani flags were draped in mourning and the courts were deserted by lawyers. Similar demonstrations occurred at Palermo, Catania, Messina, and other cities.

At Palermo, where the most serious trouble occurred, one man was killed and many injured. Troops were called out to suppress the rioting.

The Senate has been called in extraordinary session and its president will submit to the members the order of Signor Nazi's arrest. It is believed the Senate will agree to Signor Nazi's temporary release and on November 4th it will convene as a high court of justice and try the former minister.

HARRIMAN MEN IN OREGON.
