RESCUE SLAVE GIRLS.

In Raiding Deas In Chinatown Detectives Capture 15 Girls Held Captive. SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 1.—In a raid organized and conducted by United States Secret Service Agent Richard H. Taylor 15 Chinese slave girls were captured yesterday and were taken to the Alameda County jail. They will be brought before United States Commissioner Heacock and given an opportunity to show cause why they should not be deported. Eight of the women claimed to be natives of the United States and seven said that they were married and were permitted to land as wives of Chinese domiciled in this country. All were admitted at this port. Six of them do not appear to be more than 16 years of age.

WHEAT DESTROYED BY FIRE.

ABERDEEN, S. D., Aug. 1.—One hundred and sixty square miles of growing grain in Southern Brown and Northern Spink Counties were practically destroyed Tuesday by the worst hail storm in this vicinity in years. The storm was preceded by and accompanied by a strong wind and in half hour the loss was complete. The region damaged is in the heart of the richest country in this section.

BIG CONTRACT FOR JUTE.

OLYMPIA, Wash., August 1.—The state board of control today issued calls for bids to be opened August 19 for 4000 bales of jute for the state penitentiary grain bag factory. The contract will be about \$80,000, as jute prices are about \$20 a bale now, or about \$7 less than in January.

CUTS UP WITH THE GIRLS.

Jack the Slasher Wades Into Skirts With Knife But Can't Tell Why. DENVER, August 1.—"Jack the Slasher" was arrested in this city after he had slashed the dresses of nearly 30 women and girls on the streets. He was caught in the act and when searched he had a keen knife and a number of bits of slashed dresses in his pockets. He gave the name of Peter Magoffin and his occupation as a laborer. He could not explain his actions.

INVESTIGATION COMPLETED.

CLINTON, Ohio, August 1.—The grand jury has completed the investigation into the Pat Magill case and will report tomorrow.

SENTENCED TO HANG.

CHICAGO, August 1.—Herman Bilik, convicted of the murder Mary Vzul by poisoning, today was sentenced to hang October 11.

SELECTING BRIBERY JURY.

SAN FRANCISCO, August 1.—Comparative rapid progress was made today, the first day of the trial of T. V. Halsey for the alleged bribery in connection with the telephone franchisees. Forty-eight veniremen were examined during the day and of these nine withstood qualification tests and were accepted, but subject to preemptory challenge by either side.
