ASPHALT BURNS HIM

**Smed Oli, a Turk, is Injured in
Explosion.**

UNDERSTANDS NO ENGLISH

While Working On Asphalt Boilers Oli
Strikes Screw With Sledge Hammer
And Is Thrown High In The Air By
Explosion—Had Been Warned.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 19.—Forget-
ting numerous warnings which had been
given him, Smed Oli, a Turk, employed
on an asphalt kettle at Laguna street
and Golden Gate avenue, used a sledge
hammer on a screw on top of the ket-
tle yesterday afternoon, and caused an
explosion, which blew him into the air
and caused injuries the marks of which
Oli will carry to the grave. His face
was practically wiped clean of skin and
his eyesight may be destroyed.

Oli does not understand English to
any extent and that may have had some
part in causing the accident. While the
engineer in charge was cleaning one of
the boilers of the big asphalt machine,
Oli ascended the other to tighten a
screw and prevent the escape of steam
from the kettle in which the asphalt
was being heated. His instructions had
been to shut off the pressure before med-
dling with the screw, but, instead, he
used a sledge hammer on it, while fifty
pounds steam pressure were trying to
force it upward. The combined forces
snapped the screw as though it had been
of wood, and Oli the lid which the screw
held in place and the asphalt were blown
in to the air.

The explosion could be heard for sev-
eral blocks around. Oli was picked up
fifteen yards from the kettle and a rain
of asphalt spattered about the vicinity.
Oli was rushed to the Central Emergen-
cy hospital where his injuries were treat-
ed.

SHOOTS FRIEND FOR DEER.

The Regular Summer Accident Occurs
This Time Near Eugene.

EUGENE, Aug. 19.—News reached
here yesterday afternoon of one of the
regular summer accidents, which hap-
pened the day before at Bellknop
Springs when Martin Ophus shot and
killed Edward Olsen for a deer.

As the place is 70 miles back in the
country details are meagre but the fol-
lowing letter telephoned from McKen-
zie Camp, half way between the scene
of the accident and this place, by George
Kroner to the nearest telephone agent
explains the matter.

"Edward Olsen and Martin Ophus
were out hunting, Ophus saw a deer be-
tween them, not seeing Olsen Ophus fired
killing Olsen. Ophus came to camp and
told the story. Sent for justice of the
peace at Blue River; he had not arrived
at 6 o'clock this morning, Ophus and
Olsen were bosom friends."

A coroner's jury will look into the
case today.

EMPRESS DOWAGER SICK.

Queen of China Again Reported Ill and
Factions Arising in Government.

TOKIO, August 19.—Private dis-
patches from Peking forecast a gloomy
future owing to the unsettled state of
politics there, caused by the absence of
a ruling mind powerful enough to cope
with the situation. The Empress Dow-
ager, who heretofore has been sole mis-
tress of affairs, is now in a critical state
of health. Her policy so far has been to
play one Minister against another in
order to prevent the concentration of
power in any single hand.

Inasmuch as the Empress is incapaci-
tated by an incurable disease, and as
the historical animosity of the manchus
and mandarins is increasing, the pre-
vailing state of affairs in the Peking
government constitutes a baffling problem.
Whatever compromise may be effected
between the progressive Yuan Shih Kai
and the conservative Cheng Ti Tung,
there appears little hope of realizing the
complete stability of Peking authority, so
imperatively necessary to the integrity
of the empire and the peace of the Far
East in general.

While a fresh guarantor of peace has
appeared in the form of the Russo-
Japanese entente, peace will be constant-
ly subject to disturbance until some de-
cided measures are taken to re-establish
order in Peking politics. This, however,
is deemed impossible of accomplishment
so long as a Manchu and a mandarin
survive.
