do something to ease the situation. There is a world-wide financial disturbance. It is felt in the Bourses in Paris and Berlin and British consols are lower. Our New York Stock Exchange disturbance has been particularly severe but it is believed to be due to matters not particularly confined to the United States and to matters wholly unconnected with any governmental action; it may all be that of the government's determination in which, gentlemen, it will not waver, to punish certain malefactors of great wealth has been responsible for some of the troubles; at least to the extent of having caused these men to combine to bring about as much financial stress as they possibly can, in order to discredit the government's policy, and thereby secure a reversal of that policy so that they may enjoy fruits of their evil-doings, that they have misled a great many people into believing there should be such a reversal, is possible. If so, I am sorry, but it will not alter my attitude. Once, for all time, let me say, so long as I am concerned, for the 18 months of my administration that remain there will be no changes in the policy we have steadily pursued, nor let up in our efforts to secure an honest observance of the law, for I regard this contest as one to determine who shall rule this government—the people, through their governmental agents or a few ruthless, determined men whose wealth makes them particularly formidable, because they are behind the breastworks of corporate organizations. I wish there to be no mistake on this point. It is idle to ask me not to prosecute criminals, rich or poor.

"But I desire no less emphatically to have it understood that we have taken and will undertake no action of vindictive type and, above all, none which shall inflict great or unmerited suffering upon innocent stockholders and upon the public as a whole.

"Our purpose is to act with a minimum of harshness compatible with obtaining our ends. In the man of great wealth who earned his money honestly we recognize a citizen worthy of all praise and respect.

"Business can only be done, under modern conditions through corporations and our purpose is heartily to favor corporations that do well. The administration appreciates that liberal but honest profit for legitimate promoters and generous dividends for capital employed either in founding or continuing an honest business venture are the factors necessary for successful corporate activity and therefore, for generally prosperous business conditions. All these are compatible with fair dealing, as between man and man, all rigid obedience to the law. Our aim is to help every honest man, every honest corporation and our policy means in its ultimate analysis a healthy and prosperous expansion of the business activities of honest business men and honest corporations.
