GREAT CONGRESS

Assemblage of Brilliant Irrigation Educators.

CHAMBERLAIN WILL ATTEND

Will be Held at Sacramento, September 2 and 7, and is Fifteenth Annual Meeting—Leading Scientists of the Country Will Attend.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., August 21.—The program of the Fifteenth National Irrigation Congress, to be held here September 2 and 7, inclusive, is now nearly complete and will be announced within a few days.

The first day of the Congress will be devoted mainly to a discussion on a very high plane, of subjects relative to the conservation of natural resources and their development. Welcoming speeches will be made by Governor Gillett, Mayor Beard and others. One of the prominent speakers will be United States Senator Francis G. Newlands, of Nevada, the author of the National Reclamation Act and a member of the Inland Waterways Commission, lately appointed by President Roosevelt. Senator Newlands will speak of the work of the Waterways Commission.

Following Mr. Newlands there will be addresses by the President of the National Drainage Association, Hon. Geo. E. Barstow of Texas. The President of the National Rivers and Harbors Congress, Congressman James E. Rendell of Mississippi, and by representatives of the National Forestry Association, the American Congress and other prominent National bodies.

Hon. Gifford Pinchot, the foremost representative of the policies of the present administration, will deliver an address on the "Conservation of Natural Resources," ex-Governor Pardee of California, who was twice president of the Irrigation Congress, will deliver an address on the "National Forest Policy."

The Governors of several states will attend and participate in the Congress and addresses are expected from all who attend. Governor Chamberlain of Oregon is President of the Congress. Governor Gillett of California is a member of the Board of Control and is taking an active interest in all the preparations. Governor Sparks of Nevada is a member of the Executive Committee.

The work of the National Reclamation Service will be represented by Mr. Morris Bien, who has charge of the legal department of the Reclamation Service, and by the Director, Hon. F. H. Newell. Among the prominent members of Congress who are expected to attend and address the session, is Congressman F. H. Currier of New Hampshire, one of the establishers of the Forest Reserves along the Eastern backbone of the continent.

The "star-features" of the program will be debates on the National forest policy and upon the proposed leasing of the public grazing lands. Prominent advocates and opponents of these measures have been asked to participate in a joint debate and unless somebody is afraid there will be a royal battle over these pet policies of President Roosevelt's administration.
