E. H. Harriman Wants All Lines
in the Country.

NO GOVERNMENT MANAGER

Not In Favor Of Federal Ownership—Is
In The Business For Resulting Profits
—San Francisco The Center Of Many
Railroads.

If wishes were railroads, Edward H.
Harriman would control every line in the
country, according to his statement made
recently at Sparks, Nevada.

"All of the railroads in the country
would be mine if I could get control of
them." Mr. Harriman is reported to have
said. "I have been quoted, jocularly to the
effect that I would manage the rail-
roads for the federal government, that
I would turn my holdings over to the
United States after a fair compensation
and act then as a commissioner. But I
was misunderstood. The time has not
come for federal ownership. Personally,
with all the lines in my possession I
would be better suited.

"What is your policy concerning the
railroads you control?" Mr. Harriman
was asked.

"To pay dividends," was the prompt
reply. "Since 1898 we have spent
\$500,000 for improvements. We want
some returns. Don't you think we are
entitled to returns from such an expendi-
ture? Mine, then, is a financial policy;
I watch that end of the game. Other
matters are left to the officers con-
cerned with them. There is not much
to that policy except to make a good in-
vestment better. Besides, they bring
success.

"Agitation of abuse of the railroads
makes harder the accomplishment of lo-
cal improvements. Facts that in them-
selves are insignificant are magnified and
distorted by the public mind until they
become harmful to the interests of the
public and to us. It is the spirit of the
age and the newspaper, so what can
we do!

"I refused to tell what I knew about
the Chicago & Alton purchase," he con-
tinued, when asked about the recent in-
terstate commerce hearing, "because the
question put to me dealt with matters
of policy. Some of them I would not
answer any more than you would if asked
from whom you bought your suspenders
or how much you paid for your shirt.

"I could not, to be specific, answer all
questions in justice to my associates in
the purchases. But now that the pro-
ceedings have been started to get these
replies, I probably would not refuse
again. Inquiries directed to me in con-
nection with the Chicago & Alton case
will probably result in the answers de-
sired by the Interstate Commerce Com-
mission. It was a business principle in-
volved that prevented me from answer-
ing questions. I may answer when the
matter comes up again."

In conclusion, Mr. Harriman said that
in the future the policy of his roads in
the matter of rates and extensions would
be to develop the state of Nevada and
the entire western territory through
both the north and south lines. Refer-
ring to San Francisco he said:

"The railroads and the capital center
there, and despite the efforts toward that
end, neither Seattle, Oakland nor any
other city will ever be able to destroy
San Francisco's bankruptcy."—N. Y.
Commercial.

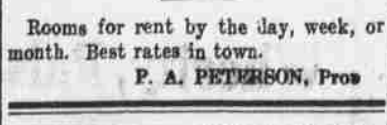
