

SAENGERFEST BILL READY

PROGRAM OF THE BIG ENTERTAINMENT COMPLETE AND ARRAY OF SPECIAL TALENT AND BIG CHORUS NEVER WAS SURPASSED

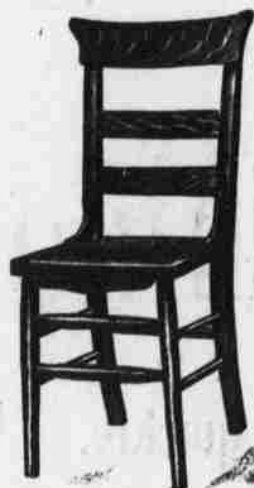
