TO PREVENT FRAUD

Officials to Investigate Citizenship Applications.

TALK DESIRABLE CITIZENS

All Applications For Citizenship Will be Sent to Washington Where They Will be Investigated—None But Those Having Qualifications Will be Admitted.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 10.—Assistant Attorney-General Alfred W. Cooley and Richard K. Campbell, chief of the Bureau of Naturalization of the Department of Commerce and Labor, have come to San Francisco to establish an office where applicants for citizenship can be investigated and fraud prevented. When seen at the Fairmont this morning Cooley said:

"Under the new naturalization laws we have an opportunity to have uniform requirements of citizens and to keep an eye on the class of people who are being admitted. By this means we are able to keep out objectionable citizens much better than before.

We are here to establish a branch of the Washington Naturalization Bureau, where we can have thorough investigation made of all applicants for citizenship and find out whether they are desirable.

"The frauds that have been practiced in the past will be put an end to by this system of examination and no one will be admitted to citizenship of the United States until he has been thoroughly investigated and a report made to the Naturalization Bureau.

"The system under which aliens have acquired citizenship in the past was very loose, and the state laws which had jurisdiction were not properly enforced, so that it was no great feat to practice fraud on the government, but

there will be no opportunity of this kind longer.

"The system by which citizenship is acquired is not changed by the new laws, only the applications must be filed in duplicate, one of the copies being sent to Washington, where the facts are scanned and furnished to the branch bureau which we are establishing. There an investigation is made and facts gathered, giving the government a case in court when the applicant comes up for admission to citizenship. Previously the government was never adequately represented in court. It had no means of examining into the character of the applicant, and unless he proved a flagrantly bad character he was able to get his papers without trouble. Under the new system he will have to prove his eligibility to citizenship, and the government will be in possession of all the facts of his career, and be in a position to combat his admission if he is not worthy or fit."
