PANAMA CANAL SMALL.

Question Arises, Will Battleships be Too Large to Enter in a few Years.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 12.—Will the Panama canal be obsolete for war and commercial purposes before it is completed and will it prevent the construction by the United States of monster battleships?

These questions will be submitted for the next Congress to answer. Under the present plans, the Panama locks are to have a width of 100 feet. The two new battleships will have a beam of eighty-five feet. The most skilful towing with only seven and one-half feet of lee-way on each side of these ships would be necessary to get them through the locks without serious damage to the ships or locks or both.

All the greater navies are gradually increasing the width of their ships while the big transportation companies are doing likewise. Our naval records show that the beam of war ships is increasing on the average of one foot yearly. It is expected that the Panama canal will be completed in about seven years. If the same ratio of progress is maintained in naval construction during that time, battle ships with ninety-two feet beam will be afloat.

SHORT FRUIT CROP

Hurts Canning and Sugar Refining Business.

FRUIT JAR COMPANIES LOSE

Orders Were Placed For Large Quantities of Jars When Blossoms Were on Trees—Now Companies Will Have Them in Hands For Year.

DENVER, Sept. 12.—Not only is the canning business in Colorado seriously injured by the decrease in the fruit crop this year, but the loss extends to the sugar industry, and the fruit jar companies, both of which suffer in consequence of the shortage. While the farm is curtailed of the earnings of a season, the fruit jar company loses the sale of thousands of jars which are manufactured long in advance of even the blossoming of the fruit trees and the fact that the fruit as far as the Missouri river is scarce means that the sugar men will have difficulty in marketing even away from Colorado the vast stock of sugar laid in for the preserving season.

The fruit jar companies begin to receive orders for jars and cans from December 15 to March 15, deliveries to be made to dealers from May to July.

The dealers give their orders early, but when the crop is a failure as so happens this year the supply left from the year before is usually ample and the new jars are not accepted.

It is estimated that from 75 to 80 per cent of the orders will not be required. This means up a loss of between \$35,000 and \$40,000

Colorado consumes only a small per cent of her sugar product, something like 25 per cent being the estimate. This amounts to 600,000 bags and the remainder is shipped to the fruit packers as far east as the Missouri river. They will not need it this year, nor will the canners north or south. Colorado will leave untouched \$22,000 worth of the saccharine product. The fruit grower can, by advancing his prices, make up some of his loss, but the jar manufacturer, the sugar man and the canner must suffer. Canned goods next winter will cost one-fifth more than in previous years. A total loss, suffered by factories and sugar companies, amounts approximately to \$80,000.

Boyle had been out of work for some time and it is said he had been drinking heavily.
