NOT READY FOR HOME RULE.

Representatives Reynolds and McKinney Agree About Filipinos.

MANILLA, Sept. 13.—After making a tour of the Philippine archipelago and carefully considering the conditions, Representatives John M. Reynolds, of Pennsylvania, and James McKinney, of Illinois, sailed for home today. Many government officers and merchants assembled to bid them farewell. Mr. Reynolds said: "I leave the Philippines with a confirmed opinion that we should continue as we have begun. We should not cross the bridge of independence till we have reached it, and we are not near it yet."

Mr. McKinney said: "If the Filipinos would show half the enthusiasm about agriculture that they show about politics, they would help to solve the problem of the future of the islands."

WHALES LITTLE JOKE

Rises Under Boat and Throws Occupants in Water.

THINK IT IS A SEA SERPENT

Two Men in Sailboat in San Francisco Bay Are Objects of Practical Joke on Part of Sea Monster—Are Rescued by Man from Dock Who Saw Accident.

BERKELEY, Sept. 13.—Charles Evans a barber, and Frank Carey, a Southern Pacific brakeman, living in West Berkeley, had a narrow escape from death while returning from Sheep Island in a small boat yesterday. A whale, according to their story, rose to the surface under the boat and upset the craft. The men were sailing in a small boat, after dark, when they encountered the whale off the Heywood wharf, on the West Berkeley shore, about 200 yards from the end of the pier. When the monster rose to the surface and "spouted," the men shifted their course in the hope of evading the animal, but a moment later were thrown into the water by the capsizing of their craft. The men were rescued by Charlie Von Halle, of the West Berkeley Furniture Company, who was on the wharf at the time of the accident. Carey and Evans are good swimmers and were able to keep afloat until the arrival of Von Halle in a small boat. In the darkness Carey thought the monster was a sea serpent. According to the description of the men the animal was nearly 100 feet long. Fishermen here are making attempts to capture the whale.

BRITISH AIRSHIP IS READY.

LONDON, Sept. 13.—The Evening News understands that the trial trip of the new British army airship will probably take place tomorrow. The final tests today were satisfactory. Twelve men, the News says, are engaged in giving the finishing touches to the airship and everything is expected to be in readiness by tonight.

The utmost secrecy is being observed. Mounted men are patrolling the neighborhood and questioning strangers. The engine is said to be similar to Santos-Dumont's.

The car is 24 feet in length and is composed of steel. The propellers are capable of 700 revolutions a minute. The ship is steered by means of a rudder.

STABBING AFFRAY OVER CANINE.

OAKLAND, Sept. 13.—In a row over a dog at Third street and Broadway this evening, Tony Schwartz was stabbed in the back by an unknown negro. Schwartz went to the Receiving Hospital for treatment, and it required two stitches to sew up the wound in his back. He later went to the police station and asked the police to search for his assailant. Schwartz says that the dog that caused all the trouble belonged to him, but that the negro was trying to take the animal away.

PIONEER KILLED BY AUTO.

SACRAMENTO, Sept. 13.—E. D. Lake, a pioneer resident of this city, 70 years old, was struck and killed last night by an automobile driven by Morris Brooks, a prominent real estate man of this city. He was thrown to the ground and sustained concussion of the brain. Lake was slightly deaf and did not hear Brook's warning horn. Four women who occupied Brook's machine saw the aged man thrown to the pavement. Lake never regained consciousness and died shortly after the accident.
