**ATTEMPT TO ROB INDIANS.**  
Land Shakes by Trick Get Them to Sign Away Lands.  
WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—An ingenious scheme designed to defraud Indians in the Indian Territory and Oklahoma of valuable coal and oil lands was discovered by census enumerators who have just completed the task of taking the population of the proposed states of Oklahoma. Reports received here are to the effect that land sharks masquerading as census enumerators induced many Indians to sign papers, signatures being necessary in each case, it was represented, as an incident in making the census of the two territories.  
It was discovered that the papers thus signed by the Indians were nothing more than conveyances of title to valuable tracts known to contain valuable mineral deposits. A thorough investigation has been ordered, and the officials are hopeful of learning the identity of the culprits. They will be criminally prosecuted if apprehended.

**GOLDFIELD FOUR YEARS OLD.**  
Pioneer Tells of 17 Prospectors Who Little Knew of Buried Wealth.  
GOLDFIELD, Sept. 20.—Four years ago Sept. 15, the Goldfield mining district was formally organized. That recent period, with its buried bonanzas begging for purchasers at a mere song, and its tiny cluster of tents, as compared with the bustling city of the desert today, flanked by the rich properties, require the pen of an inspired writer to portray.  
A pioneer of the camp, while in a reminiscent mood, in discussing Goldfield several years ago, said:  
"There were just 17 prospectors in camp when the district was organized. They were Johnny Jones, Doc O'Tool, Tom Ramsey, Bert Higginson, Harry Stimler, Billy Marsh, Al Myers, Charley Taylor, Ole Elliot, Al McClelland, Claud Smith, Bod Dunn, Doc Whitewolf, Jim Gleason, Jack Davis and a couple of others. Of course, one of the first things to be done was to select a recorder for the district. Strange to say, nobody wanted the job. Smith was known then simply as the "Kkl." as nobody knew his right name. The crowd gathered and said the "kl" was good enough for the job and if he didn't want to take it they would force it upon him."

**DOWN WITH YELLOW JACK.**  
Members of 15th Cavalry Stricken at Cienfuegos, Cuba.  
HANANA, Sept. 20.—William Fisher, a private in the 15th United States cavalry, at Cienfuegos, has been attacked with yellow fever. It is believed that he contracted the disease in the town and that in consequence there is no danger of the camp becoming a plague spot, as it is removed some distance from the city. Four more Spaniards were attacked with the disease at Cienfuegos yesterday and three more today, being a total of 14 cases on the whole island.  
Major Kean, the sanitary inspector, in reporting the case on the soldier, Fisher, to Governor Magoon, says it is not thought there is any infection in the camp of the 15th. Notwithstanding this belief, all the soldiers are under the closest inspection and supervision.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—The commission appointed by Secretary Cortelyou, of the treasury, to go abroad and examine into the matter of foreign exports, markets and market values, as they affect the treasury department, will sail on Tuesday, Sept. 17, on the Kronprinzessin Cecilie of North German Lloyd Line. The commission consists of Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, James B. Reynolds, Marion De Vries, president, and Byron S. Waite, of the board of general appraisers.  
The programme of the commission is to go directly to Paris, arriving there on Sept. 24, to be in Vienna on Oct. 9, in Berlin on Oct. 15 and in London on Oct. 25.
