WATERFRONT ITEMS

All Gasoline Boats to Observe the Law.

SAME AS BOATS OVER 15 TONS

Department of Commerce and Labor Issues Manifesto of Much Import to Concerns Operating Boats Under Fifteen Tons.

Every gasoline boat, regardless of size, operated for hire in this district-will be inspected and the owners forced to comply with the same law regulating craft of more than 15 tons burden. In- structions to get the names of the owners of the boats under 15 tons net regis- ter and other data pertaining thereto were received from the Department of Commerce and Labor yesterday morning by United States Inspectors Edwards and Fuller in Portland.

Until the district has been gone over the exact number of such craft in ser- vice will not be definitely known. But it is said there are several hundred. To get the desired information it will re- quire diligent work on the part of the inspectors and their assistants in the best part of the fall. At some time or other practically every small boat in service is operated for hire, though they are classed as pleasure boats.

With boats of more than 15 tons the law has been rigidly enforced in the last year or two, or since the agitation for minimizing the number of accidents was started, immediately after the Slocum disaster on the Atlantic coast. The owners have been forced to carry more life-saving equipment and to keep every- thing in ship-shape order. Those accept- ing positions as captains on the small gasoline launches have also been re- quired to pass rigid examinations before being given a license.

When the owners' names of the boats have been collected they will be turned over to Collector of Customs Malcolm, who will forward them to Washington. In the meantime, and beginning at once, they will be forced to comply with the law regulating the operation of the larger craft.-Evening Telegram.
