Work For Educated Women.

By JAMES BRYCE, British Ambassador to the United States. CAN remember a time when those of us who were founding colleges for women were obliged to defend their claim to receive a university education at all. In those days people

asked what women wanted with a higher teaching in languages or science. It would, so they argued, turn a young woman into what was then termed a bluestocking. Learning would make her vain of her acquirements. Pedantic and disputatious, SHE WOULD FRIGHTEN THE YOUNG MEN AWAY FROM HER. She would refuse to marry any one less learned than herself or, if she did marry, she would neglect her domestic duties and refuse to sew buttons on her husband's shirt. Well, none of these things happened.
