PORTLAND, Sept. 24.—With the exception of wheat which was steady and unchanged yesterday locally in spite of the lower prices prevailing in the East and in Europe, the cereal markets were decidedly strong. Both oats and barley were quoted higher and manufactured products scored a sharp advance.

A fair volume of business reported under way in the wheat market with farmers ready sellers and buyers generally taking the lots offered within the market range.
