## WASHINGTON 'DOPE'

Cannon's Boom Has Another Champion.

### CARRIE NATION TO THE FRONT

Feverish Interest Apparent in East Over Improving Water Routes to Kill High Freights—Ninety-Five Million Bushels of Wheat in Canada.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26.—"Uncle Joe Cannon" found another champion for his presidential aspirations this week in the person of Congressman Samuel W. McCall, of Massachusetts. The slogan from the Bay State is of considerable weight, politically, in the House and in his own country "down east," so that his endorsement is of value. Mr. McCall believes Speaker Cannon is a true statesman, despite the definition given by the late Thomas B. Reed that a statesman is a politician who is dead. Mr. Cannon, he argues, is still vigorous at the age of seventy-one, and has a fund of experience richer and more extended than probably any other public man, is conservative and in many other ways is fitted for the office of President of the United States. Incidentally, this is the first Washington has heard of the Cannon boom in many long weeks. The Illinoisan does not believe in brass-band methods too early in the game, but he is not napping. Politicians who keep their fingers clutched assiduously on the public pulse are authority for the statement that Mr. Cannon's strength will surprise his rivals, and that his political vigor will steadily increase as the convention draws near.

Another Washington educator has been drafted by the Jamestown Exposition to serve on its committee of experts. The latest is Prof. Charles E. Munroe, dean of the Department of Arts and sciences of the George Washington University, who has been invited to assume the chairmanship of the Jury of Chemicals and allied products. Two other members of the faculty of this university are on committees at the big fair on Hampton Roads. They are Dr. Truman Abbe, who is expert on the Committee on radium, and Prof. N. Monroe Hopkins, who is a member of the Jury on Electrical Appliances. Prof. Hopkins, besides being a member of the faculty of the George Washington University, is chief of the electrical bureau of the Navy. Probably at no institution in the country are there gathered together such a company of distinguished scientists as are to be found on the faculty of the local university. Many of the members have won distinction in scientific fields through their connection with government work, and thus the university is a splendid recruiting ground for the exposition authorities.

Playing the role of injured innocence, Mrs. Carrie Nation this week began a sentence of seventy-five days in the workhouse. She was convicted of disorderly conduct and declined to pay the fine assessed against her. Mrs. Nation's clash with the law came about when she invaded the post-office and insisted upon delivering a forceful lecture on the evils of cigarette smoking. She declined to desist when ordered to do so by a policeman. In court the police judge offered the saloon smasher the alternative of giving bonds to keep the peace or paying a fine of \$25. Although she had plenty of money, Mrs. Nation declined to do either. The Kansas woman has been a source of constant annoyance to the local police, and has succeeded in making herself a pestiferous nuisance.

"Feverish" is not too strong a word to use in describing the activity that suddenly has taken hold of the people of the United States in considering the question of improving the nation's rivers and harbors. Cruising the great lakes is the entire Rivers and Harbors Committee of the House; preparing for its trip down the Mississippi the beginning of next month, the new Inland Waterways Commission is busy with plans, and down in Oyster Bay President Roosevelt is putting the finishing

touches to the address he is to deliver before the Deep Waterway Convention at Memphis, which is to signalize the close of a presidential and legislative tour through the richest valley in the world that is expected to mark an epoch in the development of the country's waterways. Members of the National Rivers and Harbors Congress will be much in evidence during the forthcoming jaunt. The president of the organization, Congressman Joseph E. Ransdell, of Louisiana, is with the Rivers and Harbors Committee, of which he is a member. Mr. Ransdell is an enthusiastic believer in the efficacy of water competition to solve the rate problem. His organization, for some years past, has preached the idea of "not less than \$50,000,000 a year for waterway development." Such a sum expended by the national government would in no sense practically be thrown away, as is the case in expenditures for the army and navy, but would be a national investment that would return large interest to both the government and all the people in the guise of freight rates. That this belief is spreading is seen in the fact that shippers and business communities are rallying to the organization. Captain J. F. Ellison, of Cincinnati, its secretary and treasurer, reports an unusually gratifying increase in membership, stimulated no doubt, by the fact that the organization is to hold its annual convention in this city in December, on the eve of the convening of the Sixtieth Congress.

Ninety-five million bushels of wheat, this is the official estimate of the 1907 crop in Canada's great wheat-growing provinces, Manitoba, Alberta and Saskatchewan. Owing to the flood of immigration which has caused an immense
