

Belonged to Elmore & Company, of Astoria, and Had Been Chartered to the Wheeler Lumber Company-Covered by Insurance.

The schooner Antelope, belonging to Elmore & Company, while being towed gut from Nehalem on October 2, ran on the South Spit and is reported to be a total loss. She was bound for the Colubia river with a load of lumber and was being towed to sea by the Vosberg.

Elmore & Company had chartered her to the Wheeler Lumber Company, of Nehalem, and it is understood that she is fully insured. She was built by Bernicia, of California, for George W.

Humes, to carry lumber in 1887. She had a gross tonnage of 123 tons and carried lumber from Coquille and Rogue River for many years, being purchased by Mr. Elmore as an auxiliary for his canneries.
