KING BOYCOTTED, WILL QUIT

Carlos of Portugal Is in Bad Favor With Leading Men of the Nation.

LISBON, Oct. 7.—Boycotted by practically all the leading families in his realm, King Carlos has weakened under the pressure brought upon him by the allied party leaders and will probably abdicate within a few days in favor of the crown prince.
Against political attacks the king seemed impervious. The social campaign now being waged against him is proving too much for him, however, and he is said already to have signified that he prefers surrender to a continuation of the persecution, to which he has lately been subjected.
The boycott, deliberately engineered by Luciana DeCastro, the liberal leader, culminated today with the refusal of all members of the former ministry, of the opposition parties and of the council of state to attend the triple celebration in honor of the double birthdays of the king and the crown prince's return from his African tour.

With the refusal to take part in today's reception an intimation was given to the king that the same policy would be pursued with all royal functions during the continuation of the dictatorship. Admitting that a palace reception, unattended by the principal men of the kingdom would be a farce, Carlos abandoned the time-honored method of observing his own and his queen's anniversaries and announced that they would receive their friends' congratulations on the arsenal wharf when they went to greet the crown prince—a plan by which the monarch hopes to offset by a turn-out of the common people at least the absence of the aristocracy.

Such fear was felt, however, of a popular outbreak that extraordinary military precautions were taken to maintain order. Four lines of troops surrounded the docks and guarded the streets. Numerous detectives are shadowing suspects.

PULLMAN LADS ROUT FOOTPAD.

Boy Shoots When Ordered to Hold up His Hands.

PULLMAN, Wash., Oct. 7.—Tonight as Calvin and Joe Cox, aged 12 and 10 years old, were returning from town to their home, half a mile west of town, a man leaped into the road from a clump of bushes near the rock crusher at the edge of town and commanded them to throw up their hands, at the same time grabbing the horse's bridle. Calvin had a .22-calibre revolver in his pocket, and, although badly frightened, drew this and fired at the robber. This frightened the horse, which plunged, and, jerking away from the footpad, started to run for home. The two boys arrived in a few minutes. It was quite dark and they can give no description of the holdup except that he wore ragged clothes and looked like a hobo.

DREYFUS CLAIMS SETTLED.

Peru Announces That Home Bonds Be Paid Now at Par.

LIMA, Oct. 7.—It is stated that the French minister and the cabinet here has settled the celebrated Dreyfus claims. By the agreement Peru will pay the balance of the home debt to Chile from her guano products.

This agreement annuls the Bacourt-Er-raruriz protocol.

ST. PAUL, Oct. 7.—Governor Johnson is out with a formal statement to the press that he is not and has not been a candidate for the presidential nomination. He also states he knows Bryan is and has been a candidate for that nomination for past three months.
