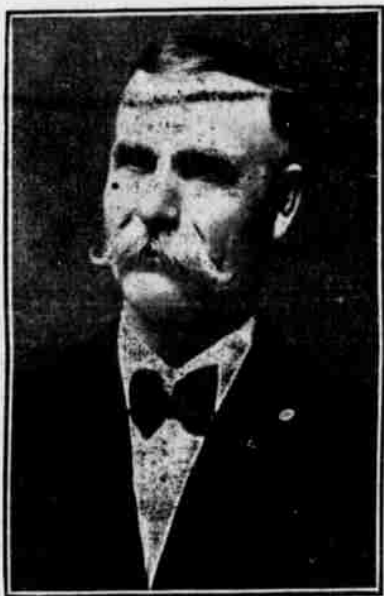

VANCOUVER, B. C., Oct. 7.—Aberdeen won a double-header from Vancouver Saturday. Starkells pitched great ball in the first game and held the Canucks safe all the way. Higginbotham was batted out of the box in the second game and retired in favor of Toneson. Clynes again got the big hand and led the hitting with a home run in the 1st game and a double and a single in the final exhibition.

TACOMA, Wash., Oct. 7.—By losing a heart-breaking game to Spokane Saturday the Tacoma Tigers threw away their last chance to win the pennant. Luck and Tacoma's inability to hit in a pinch cost the home team the game.

CHICAGO, Oct. 7.—Details of the world's championship series between the Chicago club, winner of the National League pennant, and the Detroit team pennant winner in the American League, were arrived at a meeting of the National Commission here yesterday. The schedule of games follows:

Tuesday, October 8, Chicago; Wednesday, October 9, Chicago; Thursday, October 10, Detroit; Friday, October 11, Detroit; Saturday, October 12, Detroit; Sunday, October 13, Chicago.

By arrangement of the clubs representing both leagues, the rules already existing governing the playing of the championship series were amended so that sixty per cent of the balances from the first four games played shall form a goal for the players of the two teams 60 per cent of this amount to go to the winning and 40 per cent to the losing team.

#### STATE IN DILEMMA.

Dislikes Trial to go on and Does Not Postpone it.

BOISE, Oct. 8.—Attorneys of the state and defense in the Pettibone case are in conference today trying to agree upon a course acceptable to both sides. The defense has been unwilling up to this time to agree to a postponement of the trial set for next Tuesday unless bail is granted the prisoner, who remains a patient in the hospital, clearly in no physical condition to stand the ordeal of facing a jury. If the case were begun Tuesday it would surely be interrupted by the prisoner's illness, an operation being possible at any time he chooses to go upon the table. The state is unwilling to have the trial proceed under the circumstances, and is also unwilling to let Pettibone go on bail.

#### WOULD ENJOIN EIGHT-HOUR DAY.

CINCINNATI, Oct. 8.—Several printing and publishing firms in Chicago, St. Louis, New York and Massachusetts, with National officers of the United Typothetae, brought action in the United States court today, asking that the International Printing Pressmen and Assistants' Union of America be enjoined from violating an agreement of January 4, 1907, by demanding an eight-hour day.
