**SEASICKNESS BEGINS IN EAR**

British Doctor Has a New Theory of Ailment.

LONDON, Oct. 9.—An interesting new theory of the cause of seasickness and its sure cure is put forward in a little book entitled "Seasickness: Its True Cause and Cure," which has just been published by H. Norman Barnett, F. R. C. S., surgeon to the Cripples' Home, Belfast and formerly surgeon to the P. and O. and Orient Mail line.

The internal ear, Mr. Barnett says, contains three canals hollowed out of the temporal bone, each one being set at right angles to the other two. These canals contain a fluid known as the endolymph, and they perform the function of a human spirit level.

This has been proved by experiments with pigeons. In cases where one or other of the canals have been severed the bird has lost its power to maintain its equilibrium.

Mr. Barnett's theory is that the motion of the ship causes a violent and unaccustomed motion of the endolymph, which irritates the delicate nerves terminating in the canals. These nerves communicate with the stomach and other organs, and set up the nausea and other symptoms which are characteristic of sea-sickness.

The treatment, both preventive and curative, which Mr. Barnett indicates is a free dosage with bromides under the advice of a competent medical man. The action of the bromides is to deaden the nerves and thus lessen the reaction on the stomach and other organs, until the nerves have become accustomed to the unusual motion of the endolymph.

Mr. Barnett gives several typical cases which he has treated successfully in accordance with his theory.

Mr. Barnett protests most strongly against the indiscriminate way in which persons in bad health are ordered sea voyages. In cases of phthisis in particular sea voyages, he declares, are very dangerous.

**OLD JURIST DIES**

Former Superior Judge Jones of Tehama Found Dead.

SAN JOES, Oct. 9.—Judge Theodore Elder Jones, for twenty years Superior Judge of Trinity county, was found dead in his bed at his home at 978 South Second street this morning. Judge Jones, who had been residing in this city since 1903, had been seriously ill for several years. He was 77 years of age and he leaves his wife and a daughter.

**BRIDEGROOM IS EMBEZZLER**

Captain William Gunn Said to Have Family on Coast.

NEW YORK, Oct. 9.—For Miss Gertrude Fentham, a beautiful girl who was married September 23rd to Captain William E. Gunn, manager of the Schuyler Arms apartment hotel a sad awakening is coming. Today, while the couple are in Europe enjoying their honeymoon, it has developed that the dashing bridegroom is short in his accounts a good many thousands of dollars, and worse than that, he is alleged to have a wife and three children somewhere on the Pacific Coast.

Gunn had a good salary, but is said to have been living beyond his means for some time before he married Miss

Fentham. At the Schuyler Arms, where he had his rooms, he posed as a bachelor. He was about 40 years old, handsome and refined. With the guests of the house he was a great favorite.

There is little doubt as to how he got his title of Captain. According to one story he had been navigator, but some of his friends understood he commanded a company of volunteers in the Spanish-American War.

**ROOT THANKS MEXICAN NATION.**

Does so in Reply to President Diaz's Welcome at Garden Party.

CITY OF MEXICO, Oct. 9.—At a garden party last night Secretary Root spoke in part as follows, in reply to President Diaz:

"I thank you most sincerely for the kind and gracious words which you have used regarding myself, regarding my President, from whom I bring to you and to the Mexican people a message of deep and warm friendship and good wishes.

"It is my hope that, through more perfect understanding and through personal intercourse and the more complete union of action required by the industrial intercourse of the men of Mexico and the men of the United States, not only may our friendship be increased, but our power for usefulness which demonstrates the right of nations to be perpetuated, may be enlarged.

"For the generous hospitality, for the spirit of friendship with which your people of Mexico have welcomed me as a representative of the United States, I thank you and them."

**WILL OPPOSE STRIKEBREAKERS.**

Serious Outbreak is Expected in Cuba When Farley's Men Arrive

HAVANA, Cuba, Oct. 9.—In consequence of the announced coming of Farley's strikebreakers the railroad strike situation here became more serious today, as the promised advent of the strike breakers caused a great deal of anger, and it is expected it may mark the beginning of violence. The railroads are for the most part tied up, although some trains are moving irregularly on branch lines. The mails are carried to many points on ponies and bicycles. Governor Magoon is generally held responsible for the strike because of his attitude in the cigar makers' strike, which resulted in the strikers obtaining American money in their pay envelopes. It is believed that hereafter all striking bodies will demand pay in American money.
