#### CZAR STIRS GERMANS.

Cancellation of Orders for Ships Causes Discussion.

COPENHAGEN, Oct. 11 .- Concerning the Czar's order that no Russian man-ofwar shall be built outside of Russia, the correspondent learns the following from a prominent Russian diplomat. At the meeting of Kaiser and Czar at Swinemunde one of the principal questions discussed was whether German ship-



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
