that he was before the trouble, Mrs. Overton swore that Jennings rented a room at her rooming house and that Mrs. Bowlsby called on him. The first time she called, and inquired for lennings, there was no answer to the knocking on the door. Mrs. Overton, at Mrs. Bowlsby's request, procured keys and opened the door, finding Jennings asleep in bed. She saw a pistol on the stand near the bed. Another time Mis-Bowsby and a man asked for Jennings who was not in his room. They seemed auxious to see him. Mrs. Bowlsby gave his name as Chas, Jenkins. Bowlsby also roomed at the house after Jennings left. He asked about Jennings and his wife, and seemed to be able to talk of nothing else. He stayed several nights, and slept but very little, as, at different hours of the night, when she was called up to wait on guests, she ound him sitting at the front window, looking out. Jennings did not stay for the full week for which he had paid, and a friend came and got his things,

The doctor gave it as his opinion that in such a case there would be a strong possibility of insanity, in fact would say that he was insane. The District Attorney, in his cross examination, asked that if several of the supposed symptoms were eliminated, would the balance still indicate insanity? The doctor clearly explained the different symptoms, those having weight, and those not bearing to this disease was not incurable, and the answer was that the doctor did not treat insane patients, but said that there were two forms, "acute" and "passive" and there were differences of opinion on that point. Dr. Henderson, when called to the stand testified that he had been a professor in the American Medical In-

(Successors to Dr. Linton's Drug Co.) stitute, of St. Louis, and had studied insanity. He gave a thorough descrip tion of the different symptoms, as they were given him, and in answer to the hypothetical question, he answered that a man acting in the manner described was undoubtedly mentally unbalanced. In arriving at his conclusion and in classifying the disease he would note the most important symptoms, the most prominent symptoms, and in this case would call it emotional insanity, with melancholia predominating. No two authors of his acquaintance agreed on the question of its being curable. Emotional

insanity refers to the emotions, such as fear, hate, love, etc., and that if the cause of the derangement was removed it might be cured. Bowlsby was the last witness of the day, and gave a clear account, to the jury, of the arousal of his suspicions; how he had tried to induce his wife to sever her relations with Jennings, finally ordering her to leave her employment and return home, to attend to her duties there. He told how he would find Jennings in his wife's company, on the porch of his home, and how the deceased would avoid him.
