It is also explained that many inefficient telephone instruments are now in use on local and private lines and that it is distinctly for the advantage of the Bell system as a whole that these should be replaced by standard instruments.

Those who have watched recent happenings among the independent telephone interests of the country may see a bit of interesting prophecy in the statement that as regards the Western Electric Company becoming an aggressive competitor of the independent manufacturers who, up to this time, have had a monopoly of the selling trade in this country.

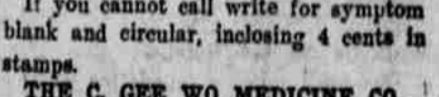
