WILL PAY TAXES TO STATE

COUNTY COURT MET YESTERDAY AND ORDERED THE LAST HALF OF STATE TAXES PAID—OTHER MATTERS ATTENDED TO.

The county court met yesterday, County Judge Tronchard and Commissioner Larsen being present.

The court ordered that the last half of the taxes for the year 1907, be remitted to the state treasurer at once.

The county clerk was directed to write to Louis Nystrom, and inform him that he will be allowed to use the cedar caps of the old bridge, for mudsills on the new one, and it is understood that the bridge will be four feet lower than the present one.

In regard to the bridge across Alder Creek, on the road from Jewell to Elsie, J. H. Smith was instructed to make a fill instead of a bridge, as per his letter.

Road District No. 10 was credited with \$101.00, which was transferred from the general fund. The attention of the boundary board having been called to certain districts, asking that truant officer be appointed, and it appearing that the city has appointed such an officer, for Astoria, the rest of the districts are asked to notify, the county judge of any, cases needing attention, and they will be promptly attended to.

G. A. Neal was appointed superintendent of the draw bridge the former superintendent having died. The salary will be \$5 per month dating from October 7.

The application of A. Osborn for purchase of land was denied.

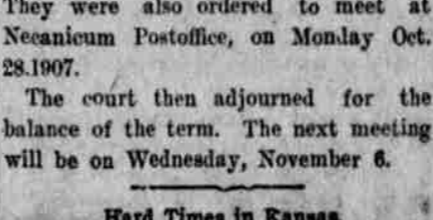
Geo. Stevens, as surveyor, A. W. Duncan and Henry Hills, of Hamlet, were ordered to make a preliminary survey, with probable grades, and probable costs of road to connect with Tillamook county road at the county line. They were also ordered to meet at Necanicum Postoffice, on Monday Oct. 28, 1907.

The court then adjourned for the balance of the term. The next meeting will be on Wednesday, November 6.
