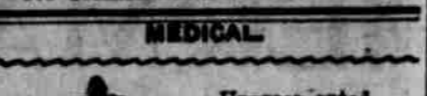

ILLEGAL CHECK.

NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—Hinting at an evil condition of affairs in the Knickerbocker Trust Company. Attorney-General Jackson asserts that there is in the vaults of the institution an illegal check for \$1,000,000. He says that after the company had been put in the hands of the acting superintendent of the bank, a man had gone to the examiner and had tried to obtain that "questionable paper," but his request had been refused. The man who had made that application, the attorney-general said had been mentioned to him by the counsel for the institution as an excellent man for the receivership. The attorney-general was spurred into making his statement by criticism aimed at him by directors of the Knickerbocker.

ITALIANS EXCITED.

ROME, Oct. 28.—Stories that several Mississippi towns are threatening to expel Italian children from their schools have aroused a bitter feeling of resentment against Americans throughout Italy. The government has made inquiries through diplomatic channels concerning the truth of the reports. The Foreign Office is besieged, however, by persons with relatives in America, anxious to know whether the Italian government intends to protect its subjects abroad.

DECLARE CLIENTS SOLVENT.

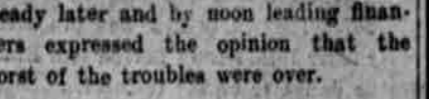
