Departure of Secretary Attended by Cheering Crowds.

ISLANDS HAVE GREAT FUTURE

Secretary and Mrs. Taft Leave Manila on Way to Vladivostok and Will Start on Their Trans-Siberian Trip Next Week.

MANILA, Nov. 9 .- The departure of Secretary of War Taft from this city on the cruiser Rainbow for Vladivostok today was attended by a remarkable demonstration on the part of the Fillpinos. The horses were withdrawn from the carriage in which were seated Mr. and Mrs. Taft, and it was pulled by Manila school boys from the Luneta to the dock through cheering crowds o citizens.

Mr. Taft started from the residence of Governor-General Smith at 8 o'clock this morning. He reviewed the long military, civic and school parade on the Luneta at 9 o'clock, making a brief address in which he thanked the people for their reception, praised the course of the assembly and expressed his con-

fidence in the future of the island. Mr. Taft and party embarked at 11:30 a, m. and sailed at 11:50, the launch or which they were being escorted down the bay by a flotilla of harbor launches with military and civic officials on board to the Rainbow where they said their good-byes. Mr. Taft and party expect to arrive at Vladivostok on November 18 and to leave there on their trans-Siberian journey on November 19. All of the party were in the best of health. Introducing their Original Indian Sketch In an interview with a representative of the A. P. before his departure, Mr. Taft said:

"I feel deeply grateful for the reception and entertainment given me by the people of the Philippines. It far exceeds in its warmth and spontaneity, anything I expected, and I cannot sufficiently express my gratitude and satisfaction.

"The condition of affairs in the Philippine government is most satisfactory and taken throughout the progress made during the past two years is remarkable.

"From the first I had full confidence in the legislative assembly a confidence MATINEES which has been justified by its actions.
