HARRIMAN FILES BRIEF.

Claims Interstate Commission Has No Power Over Him.

NEW YORK, Nov. 12.—The reasons given by E. H. Harriman why he should not answer certain questions put to him during the investigation by the Interstate Commerce Commission, are set forth in a brief which has been filed by former Judge Lovett, counsel for Harriman. The proceedings brought by the commission to compel Harriman to answer questions is to come up before Judge Hough of the United States circuit court tomorrow. The principal point in the brief is the contention that the acts, concerning which Harriman was questioned, do not relate to Interstate Commerce, but were designed to compel the disclosure by him of transactions, which they claim had taken place: "Neither commission nor Congress of the United States could afford constitutional remedy." The brief also sets forth that Harriman does not admit the Interstate Commission has any powers, other than those conferred by the act of Congress approved February, 1897, and the amendments thereto.

CHARGED WITH MURDER.

HOQUIAM, Wash., Nov. 12.—Herbert Norman, alias Ralph W. Steel, was arrested last night by the Hoquiam police on the charge of murdering Frank Todd, a logger, who was cruelly slain in his own woodshed on the night of August 31 last. Steel was placed under surveillance shortly after the death of Todd. Recently the local police force publicly exonerated Steel for the purpose, it is now believed, of throwing him off his guard. What he has betrayed to cause his arrest is not known.

WAR TO KNIFE.

NORFOLK, Nov. 12.—That there will be war to the knife between the American Federation of Labor and the National Association of Manufacturers was evidenced at today's session of the Federation of Labor.

CAN'T HURRY GILLETTE.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 12.—"No amount of pressure can make me hurry up action in convening an extra session of the legislature. I am not going to be precipitate in the matter. There is a call for mature consideration to both sides of the question and a demand for the weighing of ulterior results. I can say nothing definite just now. If it is deemed expedient to call the extra session I shall do so, but in any case it is not likely that anything will be done in this line during the week."

This statement was made by Governor Gillette, who also referred to the prolongation of the legal holidays.

He said that it was not a question of his own inclination in the matter, but rested entirely with the financial aspect of the east. He seemed to think, however, that the legal holidays would extend far into this week, and perhaps slightly beyond. If the situation warranted a removal of the order he would lift it, he said.

The governor seems hopeful and pointed out that patience and forbearance were the necessities of the hour.

TRINIDAD, Colo. Nov. 12.—Checks and currency to the amount of \$22,000, intended as wages of the Carbon Coal & Coke Company's miners at Coakdale, were lost or stolen yesterday afternoon while in transit in the stage from the railroad station to the camp, the distance is only two miles. Charles Macomber, the stage driver, was arrested on suspicion but declares he knows nothing concerning the theft. The money package had been carelessly thrown with other express matter into the stage.

NEGRO SCHOOLS. CHICAGO, Nov. 12.—A despatch to the Tribune from Lexington, Ky., says: Berea College plans a new school for negroes of the type of Tuskegee and Hampton. Trustees of the college will meet next month to determine its location. It is expected two or three other struggling negro schools of Kentucky will form a merger with the new enterprise. The amount set apart in Kentucky for the education of the colored race is \$200,000.
