OUTLOOK CHEERFUL

Conservative Bankers Say Situation is Different from 1893.

COUNTY NOT FACING DISASTER

Factors That Make For Prosperity—Great Rush of Foreigners Back to Europe—Record Rental Prices in Big Skyscrapers.

NEW YORK, Nov. 29.—While the money stress continues and a great many business men have become pessimistic as a result of the difficulty of securing currency to carry on their operations, the feeling among the best informed financiers is distinctly more cheerful than it was a month or even two weeks ago. A consensus of opinions gathered this week among the directors of the Bankers' Trust Company, which is made up of representatives of the strongest financial institutions, including national, state and private banks, brought out the following opinion which may be taken as the authoritative summing up of the situation as it is viewed by conservative banking interests: "It is absurd to believe that this country is facing great disaster. Those people who say that we are ruined are either panic-stricken or else cannot see the conditions that surround them. It is perfectly true that the currency situation at the present time has resulted in a let-up in business and may cause liquidation to run further. A certain recession in business is one of the inevitable results of the extravagance that has marked the life of the country for the last five or six years; one of the consequences of the labor situation and of excessively high wages. But to believe that this business depression will be of the severity and duration of that which began in 1893 is, for the intelligent observer, almost impossible. At that time the railroads were loaded down with the cost of extensions that yielded insufficient revenues to support the investment. The situation with respect to railroads today is about as different as day is from night. In 1893 western farmers, after several crop failures, were struggling under heavy mortgages, and their banks were light-headed and short in cash. Today the farmers have paid off their mortgages and hold, in strong, well regulated banks, handsome balances to their credit. As for large industrial corporations, like United States Steel, their position as to strength and cash reserves is infinitely stronger than was the case of manufacturing concerns in 1893 or even in 1903. Merchants in turn have in the main been conservative and in general are not now over-loaded with unwieldy stocks; their shelves are pretty clean. On top of everything the Government's monetary condition is the soundest in the world. Its debt is almost trifling as public debts go. America still holds and will hold for generations to come, the primacy in the production of cotton, wheat and corn, while the electrical development of the world is dependent upon our output of copper. These are fundamental, basic conditions that will not change, and will as years come, yield even heavier sources of profit than they have done in the past. Moreover, the wastefulness that has marked the last few years of production is now in a fair way to be swept aside. This means that the future of this country, as an outlet for safe and constant investment, will grow steadily greater and will yield eminently satisfactory returns to the intelligent and prudent investor."

President Harrison's oratorical statement made many years ago to the effect that the doors at Castle Garden always swing inward has at last been disproved. These gates are now swinging outward as never before and just about as far as their hinges will let them. As a result of the unsettled business situation thousands and thousands of foreign mill, mill, and factory workers are leaving this country in a rush never before dreamed of. The out-pouring which began about three weeks ago has now increased to a flood, with the railroads running special trains to bring the home-going foreigners to this port and the steamship companies taxed far beyond their maximum capacities. One boat this week carried away 3200 persons while steamers taking 1500 of 2000 are almost every day occurrences. From this port alone 25,000 foreigners are leaving every week, without a sign of a let-up. In the present financial state of affairs a serious phase of this sudden emigration is found in the fact that they are taking with them out of the country nearly \$1,000,000 daily in hard cash while these out-going foreigners come from
