This Philip- steamer Lurline last night. nine tariff question is agitating the members of Congress from the Middle West, where sugar beet raising and beet sugar Colorado, Nebraska, Wyoming, Kansas, and a number of other states in that section are keeping close watch of this question, and if any such bill is introduced at the present session it will be a signal for an interesting fight. It is charged that the sugar trust really is behind the movement to let down the bars to Philippine sugar. The trust, it is said, can handle the Philippine competition, while it practically is helpless in the face of the compettion offered by beet sugar raising and manufacture in this country.

Senator Curtis of Kansas, who with Senators Teller and LaFollette has just completed an investigation into alleged frauds against the Kickapoo Indians, reported to the President this week that conditions were almost indescribable. The three Senators, who were appointed as a sub-committee on investigations, joined in urging on the President the appointment of a special assistant attorney general to handle the prosecutions that will be recommended by the full Senate Committee on Indian Arfairs. As a result of these proposed prosecutions, it is very likely that Territory and elsewhere may find themselves safely inside penitentiary walls before many months are over Senators Curtis, Teller and LaFollette found in existence the most remarkable state of fraud, perjury and forgery against the Kickapoos, whose valuable lands in the Indian Territory near Shawnee have passed into the hands of a conbination of men. The report declares that deeds were recorded from people who have were induced to sign away five or six tracts of land under the impression that they were conveying only one tract to the purchaser. President Roosevelt is said to be thoroughly aroused over the revelations and will give instructions for a most vigorous prosecution of the guilty men, as well as or the institution of court proceedings to set aside the fraudulent transactions.

The Agricultural Department this week learned of the success of a new industry of which it has heard little in the past several months. Sylvester N. Coombs of San Francisco has arrived with the glad report that the raising of silk worms in Southern California is a complete success. According to Mr. Coombs, within the next three months a large plant will be, running in Los Angeles to handle the cucoous now being produced. Already the State of California is offering special inducements to the farmers to grow silk in the southern counties, for it is in this kind of counties that the silk produced is said to be of an exceptionally fine quality. One ounce of eggs, costing about \$5, will hatch as many worms as 40,000 pounds of young mulberry, until the worms go into chrysalides. It requires about 1200
