There is a decided novelty in belts known as the shaped linen belt. They



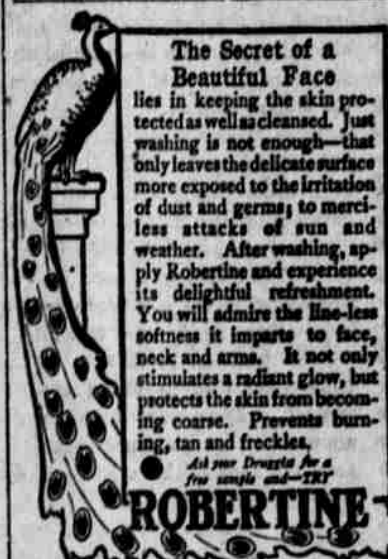
are made of a good quality of linen, closely stitched, embroidered in oriental colors and shaped so as to fit the waist closely.
