NEW YORK, Jan. 8.-Unable to meet payments due on his stock in the institution today, F. Augustus Heinze lost control of the Mercantile National bank. the conduct of which, as its president, had brought about his arraignment in the United States circuit court, earlier in the day on charges of over-certification. One year ago Heinze bought the controlling interest from Edwin Gould. with whom he pledged his holdings, as a security for his promise to pay for them in full within one year. The loan
