PORTLAND MARKETS

Latest Quotations in the Portland Markets.

Complete Market Reports Corrected Each Day Giving the Wholesale Prices of Commodities, Farm Produce, and Vegetables.

PORTLAND, Jan. 9.—The poultry arrivals this week, especially in the chicken line, were too heavy to move at the prices current a few days ago.

A few turkeys are coming in daily, but there is only a limited demand for them and they sell in a moderate way at 16 to 17 cents for live stock and 18 to 20 cents for dressed birds in good condition.

One commission firm today received a shipment of dressed turkeys that might be considered a novelty. There were 25 birds in the lot, and they were lean to emaciation, scrawny and unfit for any market.

Eggs are still weak at 30 to 32 cents a dozen, and the prospect is that they will go still lower, unless there should be a spell of cold weather that would tend to cut down receipts.
