A RECONCILED WORLD.

In 2 Cor. v. 19, Paul says: "God was in Christ reconciling the world (not the church) unto himself, not imputing their trespasses (sins) unto them."

To be reconciled is not a forced subjugation, but to come into loving harmony.

The Lord subdues his enemies by winning them to be friends.

This reconciliation of the world was first wrought out in the Person of Christ—"the Head of every man," and later, it is done in each one personally.

by the inworking of the Holy Spirit that came as the result of his victory and ascension to the Father.

The apostle tells us that by the cross the enmity was destroyed, and both Jew and Gentile (the world) reconciled to God.—Eph. ii. 13-17.

Peter learned this same lesson in the vision recorded in Acts x. When he refused to eat the unclean beasts as he was commanded, the voice from heaven said:

"What God hath cleansed, call not thou common."—Ver. 15. It is evident that the unclean beasts in the legal system represented men, as Peter understood the cleansing to apply to men, for afterward he explained to Cornelius the effect the vision had on him:

"God hath shewed me that I should not call any man common or unclean."—Ver. 23.

What was thus done in Christ expresses God's purpose for the world, for whom Christ died and rose.

In Colossians i. 20, that purpose is expressed—to reconcile all things unto himself.

In Ephesians i. 10, we are told that all things shall be gathered together in Christ.

In Philippians ii. 9-11, we see that Jesus humbled himself, even to the death of the cross, and was therefore highly exalted (lifted up), that to him every knee should bow, and every tongue confess him Lord; and only by the Holy Spirit can they do this.—1 Cor. xii. 3.

Jesus himself expressed this truth when he said: "If I be lifted up (highly exalted) will draw all unto me."—John xii. 32.

He gave himself a ransom for all, and therefore will have all saved and brought to the knowledge of the truth, which is eternal life.—John xvii. 3; 1 Tim. i. 15; ii. 4-6; iv. 9, 10.

The grace (loving favor) of God bringeth salvation to all.—Titus ii. 11,

VICTORIA, B. C., Jan. 11.—In a report to the Ottawa Government, Captain Newcomb of the fishery protection cruiser Kestrel, asks that a modern cruiser, like the Canada, on the Atlantic coast, with a speed of 20 to 22 knots and two smaller boats of 16 knots each be commissioned as soon as possible to protect the British Columbia fisheries.

He gives as reasons that the halibut grounds of British Columbia are being depleted by American fishing vessels, which he says took nearly forty million pounds of halibut last year from provincial waters.

He says that the American fishermen clean their catches in British Columbia harbors and asked that fast motor launches be supplied to the cruisers to prevent this practice.
