WATERFRONT ITEMS

French Bark Arrives Here Without a Manifest.

A FINE MAY BE IMPOSED

The Northland and General de Boisduffre Arrive in—Cascade and Alliance Leave Out—Ships Clackmananshire and Glenalvon Arrive Down—Other Dock News

Yesterday was a good day on the bar and but little change took place throughout the day. At 8 a. m. the wind was from the east blowing 10 miles bar moderate. These conditions were not changed until 4 o'clock p. m. and the only change noted was that the wind had died down to five miles an hour. Two vessels passed in and the same number crossed out.

The steam schooner Cascade lumber-laden, left out for San Francisco, at 8:25 a. m. yesterday.

The steam schooner Northland arrived in from San Francisco at 8:30 yesterday morning, and left up at 11:30.

The steamer Alliance arrived down from Portland yesterday at 9 a. m. and immediately left out for Coos Bay.

The Geo. W. Elder arrived in San Francisco yesterday morning early.

The Lurline came in on time yesterday afternoon, with a fair cargo and passenger list, and left up at 7 o'clock with the usual freight and number of passengers. Capt. Larkin reports things quiet along the river.

Judge Becker Appointed by Bonaparte to Assist F. J. Heney.

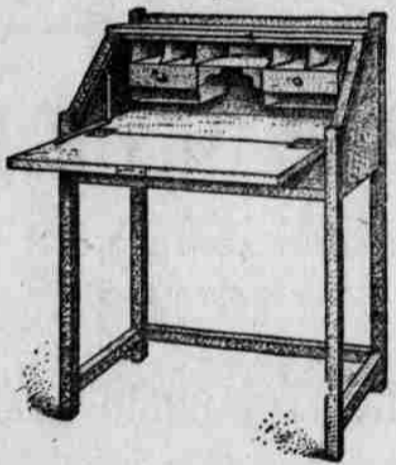

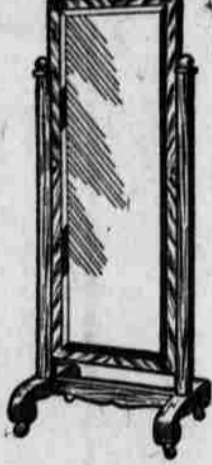

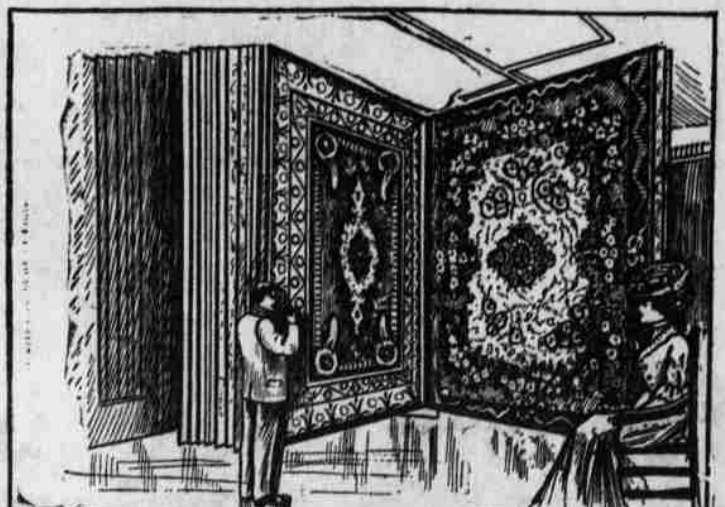

Portland, arrived at Yokohama on January 11th.

The French bark General de Boisduffre arrived in yesterday. She sailed from Rochester, Eng., and is loaded with cement for Portland, and when she reached here and was boarded by the customs officer, Capt. J. Larogue was unable to produce a manifest. The captain is in hopes that the owners of the vessel mailed the manifest to Portland and a telegraph message has been sent asking its speedy delivery here, if there, to save the captain a fine of \$500. According to law Captain Larogue has 48 hours, after arrival in which to make entry at the custom house and if the manifest has been mailed to Portland and in turn remailed to Astoria so as to reach here before tomorrow noon all will be well, otherwise the captain will be fined \$500. An explanation as to how the captain failed to have a manifest has been offered. The vessel sailed from Rochester and at London received a clear bill of health, but no manifest. The vessel came via Hobart still no manifest, and when he reached here the captain had only a clear bill of health. If the manifest does not reach here from Portland the fine will be imposed.

Columbia river Light Vessel Station, page 30, No. 97 (List of Lights, Buoys, and Daymarks, Pacific Coast, 1907, pages 46 and 53.—Stationed off the entrance to the Columbia River, about 7 7/8 miles SS. 3-8 W. from Cape Disappointment Lighthouse, Wash.

January 12 the station of the light vessel was temporarily marked by a gas buoy, painted red, and showing a flashing white light.

Clatsop Spit Buoy, 4, a first-class nun, found missing January 10, was replaced the same day.

January 10 an unlighted gas buoy was placed about 300 feet westerly of Clatsop Spit Buoy, 8, for experimental purposes only.
