PORTLAND, Jan. 1.—There was a better feeling in the poultry market yesterday. Receipts were light and the accumulated stock of chickens was worked off at slightly higher prices.

Although eggs were plentiful and slow of sale, the price was held steady at 30 cents, in anticipation of colder weather in the near future.
