PORTLAND, Jan. 20.—The apple market continues to improve. Offerings generally are of materially better quality than those of a month ago, and with the demand, especially for the better grades, fairly strong, prices are higher. A small lot of winter bananas was today offered at \$4 to \$5 a box. The best grades in other varieties are held at \$2 to \$2.50, while common to good apple sell at lower prices. In other fruits the trade generally is steady.
