PORTLAND, Feb. 3.—Egg quotations show a disposition to advance, the result of the cold weather, and if the season of low temperature continues for a few days longer the chances are that prices will go several cents above the quotations at the close of last week. Prices today were rather uncertain, a matter of guess work to some extent, for much depends upon the condition of the weather for the next few days. Some dealers quotation 25 to 26 cents, while others held stocks up to 28 cents and expressed the belief that this price could be maintained.

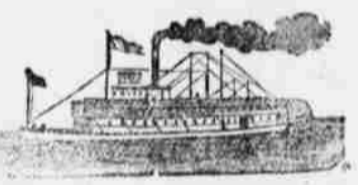
