The Move One Player Made and His Subsequent Soliloquy. "It's your move," she smiled. He smiled back at her, his hand hovering above the checkerboard.

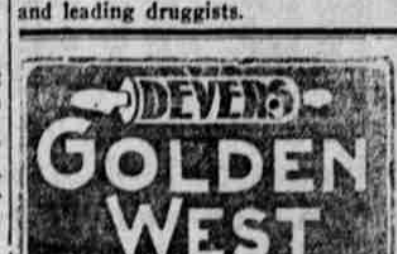
"There?" she asked, giving his ejaculation the appearance of having been conceived in subtle humor. "There?" "There!" he repeated.
