**SCHOOL TEACHING FORGERY.**  
NEW YORK, Feb. 15.—Convicted for the third time for forgery Vincer Verrall has been sentenced to ten years in prison. He is said to come from Boston and has been known by the name of Thos. Latham. In asking the court to pass severe sentence on Verrall, the assistant district attorney who convicted him, told the court that the prisoner had been for some time conducting what amounted to a school for teaching forgery. A forged check for \$27 caused the present conviction.
