The work of mapping the United States has been intrusted by Congress to the United States Geological Survey. This is the one organization se business it is to prepare a map or atlas of the entire country, and it is now and has been since its establishment in 1879 engaged continuously on this work. So far it has surveyed about 1,050,000 square miles (exclusive of areas surveyed in Al-United States.

The sheets or maps forming this atlas represents areas that have been tion and names of quadrangles mapcalled quadrangles, whose boundaries are meridians of longitude and paral-lels of latitude. About 1700 quadrangles have now been mapped. These maps are published on three different scales-1 mile to the inch, 2 miles to the inch, and 4 miles to the inch. The area mapped differ in size with the scale used, averaging 230 square miles for the first scale. 920 square miles for the second, and 3700 square miles for the third. The largest scale is used for densely populated or otherwise important areas; the next largest for scantily inhabited. mountainous, or desert regions; the smallest for areas covered by reconnaissance surveys, especially in the Western States and Alaska. What ever the scale, the atlas sheets are of nearly uniform size (the paper is about 17 to 20 inches), and are all alike in general character. They show the principal natural features of the land, such as mountains, hills, valleys, and gulches; all bodies of water, such as lakes, marshes, streams and springs; the routes of travel such as railroads, wagon roads, and trails; all political boundaries; all ings; and the names of natural and

They also indicate exactly the location of permanent survey monuments and bench marks whose positions and whose elevations above sea level have been determined by precise methods-monuments that are available as starting points for local surveys. In the areas covered by public lands surveys they show all township and section lines as well as the boundaries of all land grants.

Each of these maps is printed in three colors, black for the cultural features, such as boundary lines, roads, railroads, houses, towns, and cities, and for the names of all things represented; brown for the topography, or the element of elevation, indicated by contour lines showing the heights of all parts of the area above sea level; and the blue for the water-the river, lakes, and the sea and its bays and inlets.

These maps are sold by the Geological Survey at cost of publication-5 cents each, or \$3 a hundred-remitted by money order only, not stamps. They may be obtained on application to the Director of the United States Geological Survey at Washington, D. C.

The length of life of a queen bumblebee is probably little more than a year at most. Here is one reason for this belief: She hatches among the late broods of summer and soon after leaves the nest, leading a vagabond existence, night and day, among the autumn flowers. The winter she passes in an earth burrow dug by herself and unaided establishes a colony in the spring. These combined periods of fall and spring require the dally use of her frail wings in the field at least four months. Now, we know that the wings of the worker honeybee wear out in less than half that time; also that the old queens who take to the field after the nest breaks up in August frequently have tattered wings and soon disappear. Nature does not supply insects with new wing cells as it supplies birds with new wing feathers.
