At 8 o'clock yesterday morning the fine steamer Hassalo, of the O. R. & N. Company's Astoria-Portland service, blew her port cylinder head out, at a point just this side of Altoona. Luckily no one was injured, and the only damage aside from the ruined head, was the smashing of the piston bar where it joins the crank at the axle of the great stern-wheel. The steamer had a number of passengers on board, and in a few moments after the smash, she was pluckily wending her way up stream, landing her people, and taking on new passengers, by means of her boats. She limped her way into Portland late last night and the steamer T. J. Potter will leave out tomorrow in her place, and if she can be gotten in readiness, may come out tonight.
