PORTLAND, March 25.-Higher prices by half a cent for bananas went into effect in the wholesale market today, the result of action taken at the last meeting of the Produce Merchants' Association consequent upon the recent advance in prices made by the United Fruit Company, otherwise known as the banana trust. Bananas for the local trade are now 51-2 cents a pound, while crated they go for 6. Four cars due today were delayed and are expected to reach the city tomorrow.
