But no one is anticipating such a delinquency; the call is too obviously grave and important to result in anything but a rousing, unmistakabe, splendid challenge to every man who, openly, or in secret, is threatening the fisheries of the lower Columbia; and the impress of the work and words of that night will go forth to the farthest limit of Oregon as a sign and lesson of loyalty and a straight conception of communal duty to a State-wide interest. Anything short of this will be damning to the people here.


