To build a plant to manufacture both face building and paving brick, would require more capital than the above mentioned sum. It would mean the manufacture of brick by both the dry-press and stiff mud process. The latter process however, requires an extensive and expansive system of drying the products of the waste heat plan from hot kilns.

But when the dry-press process is once installed and operated successfully circumstances will doubtless warrant in a short time the extension of the plant to not only include paying brick but terra cotta, drain tile ******************** and other clay products as orna ments, flower pots, etc.
