that purpose? Have wireless telegraph station here which can be used on day of passing."

The exact date of this excursion cannot yet be set but it will probably be on the 20th of May. The exact cost cannot be ascertained at this time but will not be more than five dollars, including light refreshments for the occasion. The trip will in all likelihood be an all-day affair and it will quite likely be made on the Roanoke or Elder, either of which are as fine ships for the purpose as the entire Pacific Coast affords. Those who wish tickets reserved for them should make that fact known in the office either by a personal call or by telephone, at once. No money will be collected at this time but the reservations are being made according to application and there will positively be no exceptions to this rule.

The Seawall Proposition.

A committee composed of members of the city council with Dr. Logan as chairman is preparing through an attorney, Mr. A. M. Smith, a bill to be presented to the people at the December election which shall provide for the voting of a tax to bond a seawall. The matter is one of exceeding great importance and it is hoped that the members of this organization will do anything and everything in their power to accelerate the movement, more important perhaps than any other ever undertaken in the city's history.

The beach automobile road is now being rapidly completed under the direction of the Honorable County Court and automobilists may reach the beach by the way of Skipanon in a few weeks, not later than the month of June. The County Court is also pushing the work on the Nehalem road and automobilists will be able to reach Vesper probably in the month of July. If the Portland Automobile Club gets a hustle on'm so that the

road through Columbia County is completed by the time the road through this county is completed, the owners of good machines will be able to reach Portland in an easy drive sometime in July or August.
