FAREWELL BANQUET.

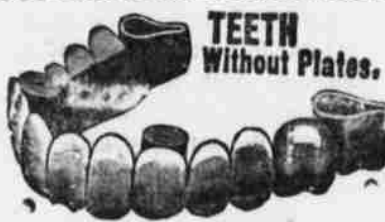
Given in Honor of Champion Amateur Billiardist.

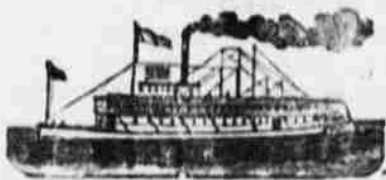

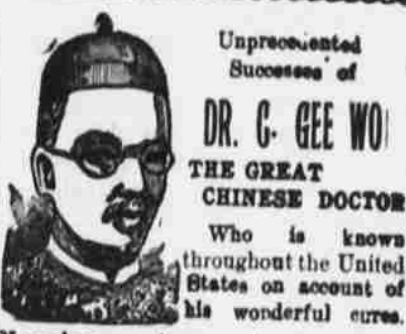

GOVERNMENT'S SUIT BROOKLYN BRIDGE

Against Standard Oil Co. Was Begun Yesterday

OIL OFFICIALS ARE EXAMINED COMPLETED MAY 24 1883

Rockefeller's Share of Earnings by Standard Oil Company in 24 Years is \$143,499,954—Henry M. Flagler Excused Until Later as Witness.

NEW YORK, May 26.—The Standard Oil Company's defense to the Government's suit against the New Jersey corporation seeking to dissolve the holding concern in on the ground that it is a trust, will be begun today before Special Examiner Franklin Ferriss in this city. Last fall Special Deputy Attorney General Frank B. Kellogg directed the government's case against the Standard Oil holdings and the holdings of other members of the Rockefeller family; also three of the others of the comparatively small group which, it is alleged, controls the corporation. Mr. Kellogg brought out that John D. Rockefeller's share of earnings by the Standard Oil Company, in 24 years, was \$143,499,954. The lawyer also elicited testimony and produced evidence respecting the method—drove competitors from the oil regions and gradually absorbed its oil.

Number of Standard Oil officials were examined on the stand including Wm. G. Rockefeller and Wesley L. Tifford, treasurer of the Standard. Henry M. Flagler, was to have been called as a witness but was excused until later. It is likely he will be called upon to testify during the next few weeks for the inquiry will probably last a month or more.

NEW YORK, May 26.—Twenty-five years ago yesterday, there occurred one of the wonders of the world. It was the opening on May 24, 1883, with a great demonstration of the Brooklyn Bridge, in commemoration of that event, American flags were flung to the breeze yesterday from the top of the greatest towers for a few years after the opening, wise acres, looking up from the terry boats held many conferences as to how long the structure would last. They never dreamed that the bridge could possibly stand the strain put upon it for a quarter of a century. In fact, soon after the opening, there was much discussion over what was termed the "folly" of permitting heavily laden wagons on the roadway.

While the record of the number of persons crossing the bridge is no longer kept, the number of trolley cars alone crossing gives a fair idea of the traffic. Between three and four thousand cars now cross the bridge every day and each car seat sixty persons, therefore, the passengers in the seats, number 200,000 a day or over 70,000,000 a year. In the first year the cable road operated a total of 8,528,000 passengers was considered enormous.

On decoration day, 1883 a woman stumbling at the foot of a flight of stairs at the New York tower, caused a panic and a crush which resulted in the death of 12 persons. This is the most appalling of the accidents in the long life of the structure. The total expenditures for maintenance and operation of the bridge up to the close of 1907 was \$21,343,509 and the total receipts were \$21,267,064.
