CHECK COMPROMISE

Will Be the Big Question of Taft Managers

TAFT AND ANTI-TAFT FORCES

Frank H. Hitchcock and Associates Considerably Surprised When Extent to Which Compromise Movement Had Found Favor Became Manifest

CHICAGO, June 9.—The outcome of the contests for the seats of the Louisiana delegation to the Republican National Convention will be the chief point of interest when the National Committees of the party re-assemble this morning. The big question will be whether the Taft managers have succeeded in checking the movement for a compromise by which the delegation from a state will be split between Taft and anti-Taft forces. There was an exchange of messages between Chicago and Washington last night on this point but the effect thereof will not be manifest until the vote is taken in the committee meeting today.

Frank H. Hitchcock and his associates were considerably surprised yesterday when the extent to which the compromise movement had found favor became manifest. The oratory of the Louisiana contestants could not hold the attention of the committee members in the face of the development and a hurried adjournment followed.

Were the Louisiana cases the only ones involved there might perhaps be a disposition on the part of the Taft managers to yield the compromise. But they point out that similar contests are pending from Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia and that if the split delegation plan prevails in the Louisiana case there will be no good reason to anticipate anything other than demands for eight more compromises.

The fact that the negro question is involved in all these states is the stumbling block. Advocates of the compromise argue that if the Foraker delegations are recognized partially, the Taft forces will gain strength among the negro voters of the North many of whom are believed to be convinced that the National Committee is discriminating against their race by its decisions in favor of the "Lily Whites" of Florida and Georgia.

Mr. Hitchcock points out in reply to this argument that many of the delegates who have been seated are negroes and that this element of the party is certain to have plenty of representation on the floor of the convention.

Indications that the advance guard of the big crowds which will be here for the convention next week will soon be on the ground became manifest early today. The New York men, 1000 strong, will arrive Saturday. They having telegraphed to this effect last night. They have been assigned 200 rooms in the Auditorium. The next largest delegation will come from Pennsylvania. Its members are expected Saturday night and most of the Illinois party will also be here at that time.

The big marching clubs that are to participate in the demonstration in convention hall Wednesday morning of next week have been assigned to the Great Northern Hotel. Most of the marchers will be here Saturday. Their part in the convention is expected to be one of the most spectacular features of the gathering.

The committee in charge of arrangements announced the musical program today. There will be no dearth of harmony as exemplified by brass instruments and in addition vocal selections of a nature calculated to enthrall the delegates will be part of the program. The first day of the convention a concert of patriotic melodies will precede the formal calling to order. "Rag-time" will be the feature of the second day and grand opera selections will usher in the third day when it is expected the presidential nominees will be named. The vice-presidential nominees will probably not be named before Friday.

The feature of the music for that occasion has not been decided upon.

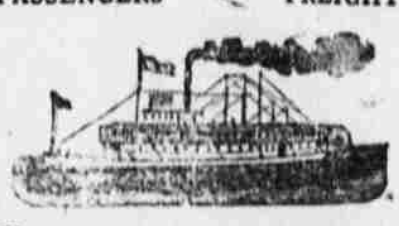
