The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, July 16.—A fact of interest in the cantaloupe and watermelon trade is that the bulk of the supply of these commodities now coming to this market is the product of a single firm operating in California, unquestionably the heaviest producer in the United States and probably the greatest in the world.

Trade in fruits generally was of good volume today and prices in all lines were about at yesterday's level. car lot receipts included one of lemons, one of watermelons and three of bananas. Peaches were more plentiful, with prices ranging from 75 to 90 cents a box. Logans were in light supply and held at 75 cents to \$1 a crate for good fruit. Wenatchee and Medford apricots were quoted at \$1.5. Berries generally sold at yesterday's prices.
