

Destroys 9 Buildings in Restricted District

MAN BURNED TO DEATH

of Montesano, Is Found Dead in Bed

LOSS ESTIMATED AT \$75,000

Northern Pacific Put Out of Commission For Several Hours-Hoquiam Fire Department Make Quick Response to Call For Assistance.

ABERDEEN, Wash., July 29.-A fire which broke out here at 2 o'clock this afternoon destroyed nine buildings in the restricted district and the trestle over which the Northern Pacific Railroad enters the city and for several hours threatened to jump the Wishkah river into the factory and residence sections. One fatality re sulted, that of a saloon habitue known as George Griswold, a drug fiend.
