

The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, Aug. 14.—There was less life in the fruit trade generally yesterday and today than for some time past, and in some lines where receipts showed an increase prices fell slightly. Grapes are now coming in freely and the best are selling at \$1.50 a crate, while there are several sorts that move at \$1 to \$1.25. Peaches hold their own fairly well, though the market is well supplied with southern Crawford and Elbertas and Oregon Hales and other sorts. As yet but few Oregon Crawford have reached the market. Apples sell in a steady way at prices ranging from 75 cents to \$1.75 a box.

Though receipts have been moderately heavy this week, the poultry market has been in much better shape than last week. Cooler weather quickened the demand to some extent and quotations on all lines have advanced 1 to 2 cents a pound. The outlook today was for a complete clean-up Saturday at the prices now prevailing, and now are in best demand, but there is a fair call for Springs, and turkeys and ducks also move in a small way. There were no new features in the egg trade today. Another carload of sweet potatoes is due from the South tomorrow and with the arrival of this car it is expected that the price of the product will decline to 4 cents a pound. At 5 cents, the ruling price so far this week, sweets have been active, but the supply was limited. The crop in California is said to be a heavy one this year, and lower prices may be looked for within the next few weeks.

PLAGUE IN VENEZUELA.

Surgeon Reports That Conditions Are Deplorable There.

SAN JUAN, P. R., Aug. 14.—Dr. Charles W. Vogel, surgeon in the United States health and marine service, sailed today on the steamer San Juan for New York. He takes with him a report of the investigation into the bubonic plague in Venezuela, where he said conditions are deplorable. The Venezuelan officials and merchants, according to Dr. Vogel, declined to give him any information and the foreign consuls were also reticent.

The surgeon said President Castro ordered the suppression of the true state of affairs, though he admitted that the plague exists.

Dr. Vogel added that he found no systematic efforts were being made to stamp out the disease and declared it would continue in Venezuela indefinitely and become as bad as it is in China if proper measures are not taken to check it.
